What is Work on Wilmington?

Work on Wilmington is an annual community service event. It brings people together to roll up their sleeves and tackle community problems in just four hours. The results are amazing. Projects that would normally take many times longer are completed in just half a day.

When is Work on Wilmington 2011?

Work on Wilmington is set for Saturday, April 21, 2012, 8 a.m. to noon, rain or shine. A volunteer appreciation celebration follows the four hours of work.

Hands on Wilmington, now *Work on Wilmington*, was initiated by the 2006 Class of Leadership Wilmington, a civic leadership program of the Greater Wilmington Chamber Foundation.
