



What kind of service projects is Work on Wilmington looking for?

Work on Wilmington seeks projects that will meet specific needs and provide tangible benefits. Projects must be able to be completed in four hours and show visible impact. They also must be unlikely to happen without the help of Work on Wilmington volunteers.

Projects may include, but are not limited to: painting, installing playground equipment, landscaping, community cleanups, small construction projects and other work that could be done in four hours with an army of volunteers. Projects accomplished in prior years included painting Laney High School, landscaping, maintenance and refurbishing work at New Hanover County schools, painting a fence around a public housing complex, working on a mural on a downtown parking deck, cleaning up and landscaping area parks, building storage shelves and moving storage items, painting underground parking area and many other such projects

Projects that require potentially dangerous work, such as roofing, heavy use of sophisticated power tools and work that requires more than a 10 foot ladder are not suitable. Some of our volunteers will have specialized skills, but many others will not.
